Overview



The Chinook Program convenes on Sunday, October 1st and spends six days immersed in intense learning. The residential portion of the program is housed in the beautiful facilities of the Aldersgate Retreat Center. The Institute includes 54 hours of structured learning time with day-long classes plus classes and facilitated conversations in the evenings.

At Chinook participants learn as much from each other as they do from the faculty. The participants come from a highly diverse cross -section of civic leadership representing public and private organizations throughout western North America. The new web of relationships will serve for years to enhance and enrich each individual's leadership role.

A key optional day follows the main program. In spring 2024, Senator David Landis will build on the earlier leadership learning by teaching how to apply that knowledge in the practical world of negotiations and collaboration. That evening the class members will meet to reflect on the learning and look ahead. New lessons will be shared to enhance the leadership growth.

Applying for the Chinook Program

The Chinook Program class is selected from those who apply. The Chinook class is generally made up of people who are significant leaders in their organizations, communities, or inter-organizational relationships. Creating diversity in terms of organization type and geographic distribution is a goal, as is creating a culturally and generationally diverse class.

Early applications are encouraged. The selected participants will be invoiced for the program fees after selection.

Cost and Logistics

The full cost for the Chinook experience is \$2,895 for the six-day residential program with single occupancy, and the Spring 2024 follow-up session.

The fee includes all onsite learning and materials plus lodging and all meals at Aldersgate during the residential program. Training fees and room and board fees will be separated on the invoice.

Discounts are available for double occupancy or for use of the on-site R/V park which has full hook-ups. The number of single occupancy rooms is limited so early application is encouraged.

The David Sawyer Leadership Fund provides limited financial support to elected and appointed officials from smaller Oregon cities. Please contact John Morgan for more information.

The Chinook Institute for Civic Leadership provides a 50% refund on all registrations canceled 30 – 60 days prior to the event. Cancellations between 30 days and 5 days before the start of the event will have a 25% refund. Cancellations less than 5 days before or during the event will not receive a refund. Substitutions may be acceptable.


